






What's wrong with a Lunch and Learn?

- People can't make time to attend AND focus
- Nobody remembers what they learn are told in Lunch and Learns
- Lunch and Learns for software rollouts are often overwhelming
- The information delivered in a Lunch and Learn if often outdated before breakfast the next day

- 1. Self-paced foundational courses organized into a Learning Path
- 2. Digital guides for actionable knowledge
- 3. Lunch & Learn practice activities

Benefits

- 1. Fits into their work schedule
- 2. Doesn't require memorization
- 3. 24/7 access to resources
- 4. Employees are prepared to adapt to change
- 5. Fewer post-training support requests
- 6. Training is available for the person who joins the company 2 weeks later

- 5. How do I send a message to multiple clients at once?
- 6. How do I explain to a client how to set up the app?
- 7. How can I resend a notification?
